Bí Cineálta



Scoil Mhuire has officially adopted a new Bí Cineálta ("Be Kind") policy, approved by the Board of Management this month.

This important step reflects the school's commitment to promoting a culture of kindness, respect, and inclusion in the school.

Bí Cineálta is more than just an anti-bullying policy — it's a whole-school approach to building a safer, more supportive environment for everyone. It encourages students to treat others with empathy and care, and to take pride in positive behaviour.


Bí Cineálta encourages every member of the school community – students, teachers, staff, and parents – to prioritise kindness in words, actions, and attitudes. It aims to foster a culture where empathy, respect, and compassion are at the heart of daily life in Scoil Mhuire.

The Board of Management has now ratified Scoil Mhuire's new Bí Cineálta Policy, which outlines:

- Our school's commitment to preventing and addressing bullying behaviour.
- Updated definitions of bullying behaviour, including cyberbullying, identity-based bullying and harassment.
- Clear procedures for reporting, recording and addressing bullying incidents.
- New requirements for oversight and annual review of bullying data by the Board of Management.
- A student-friendly version of the policy will also be developed and made available to pupils.
